

#### All Divisions (Flag, Peewee, Junior, and Senior)

#### **8 Teams Qualify**

#### Divisions w/ 2 Conferenses

• Top 4 teams from each conference will qualify based on conference record.

#### **Divisions w/ 3 Conferenses**

- Top 2 teams from each conference will qualify based on conference record (6 total).
- Two wildcards will be selected from the remaining team based on conference record.


**Seeding/Brackets**: Each division will be seeded 1-8 based on:

- 1. Overall record
- 2. Head to Head
- 3. Conference points against
- 4. Coin flip



#### **Bracket**

• Once seeded, 1v8, 2v7, 3v6, 4v5. Using the following bracket. The higher seed will be the home team.





#### **Conference Tie-breakers**

- 1. Best Conference Record
- 2. Head to head
- 3. Conference Points Allowed
- 4. Coin Toss (3 way tie odd coin wins tiebreaker, flip until tie broken)

#### Wildcard Tie-breakers

- 1. Best Conference Record
- 2. Head to head
- 3. Best Overall Record
- 4. Conference Points Allowed
- 5. Coin Toss (3 way tie odd coin wins tiebreaker, flip until tie broken)

\*3 way tie Example- A three way tie breaker of equal conference record goes head to head. If Team A has beaten Team B, Team B has beaten Team C, and Team C has beaten Team A. Then we proceed to conference points allowed. If this does not break the 3 way tie, we proceed to a coin flip. If at any point the 3 way tie is broken, the tie breaker goes back to the top of tie breakers at conference record, then head to head, and so forth until the tie is broken between the 2 remaining teams.



Non Conference games will NOT count in any Conference tiebreaker.

Non Conference games WILL count and all conference points allowed in any tiebreaker scenarios for wildcard selection or seeding of interdivisional conferences. If a conference team is played twice in a season, the second game will count towards standings unless the second game isn't played.

Best Record is determined by winning percentage except in a case of teams with no losses; then it's number of wins.

#### **Example:**

- 5. A team with an 8-0 record ranks higher than a team with a 7-0 record.
- 6. A team with a 5-3 record ranks higher than a team with a 4-3 record.
